55th ANNUAL KINSMEN MUSIC FESTIVAL

RULES & INFORMATION

INSTRUMENTAL - APRIL 21st, 22nd, 23rd, 24th, 2009

VOCAL - APRIL 27th, 28th, 29th, 2009

- 1. The 2009 Kinsmen Music Festival is under the direction of David Dekker and Sue Caron of the Kinsmen and Kinette Clubs of Cornwall.**
- 2. The closing date for Secondary music entries is april 3rd, 2009. Entries received after this date may not be accepted. Please take care that all entry forms are correctly completed with payment enclosed. Cheques are to be made payable to The Kinsmen Music Festival. (Please *print* all students' names appearing on the applications)**
- 3. Schools may elect to perform in French for one or more selections. Pieces should be of comparative difficulty to English pieces selected.**
- 4. Songs, test pieces (choirs, groups) may be transposed one tone either way. (Modern and Folk solos as necessary). Soloists must provide an original copy of their music to the adjudicator.**
- 5. A broken chord may be given on piano at the beginning of each piece of unaccompanied music, plus the beginning note or notes.**
- 6. A competitor must receive instruction only as given in his/her school. The accompanist must be the school music teacher or one designated by the school. Any student receiving private vocal or instrumental instruction should not be entered in the school category but rather the private section of the Festival.**
- 7. A competitor can enter only one solo class, but could also be involved in a group and/or choir class, with the exception of mini choirs.**
- 8. Choirs and soloists must, if necessary, warm up before taking the stage.**

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9. Music Selections for Secondary School Bands

Pieces are to be chosen from the 2008/2009 Musicfest Canada graded list. The categories are as follows:

Class 6	Open Class**
Class 5	Challenge (Senior Band)
Class 4	Senior Band
Class 3	Intermediate Band
Class 2	Junior Band
Class 1	Grade Nine destreamed

All classes are for concert bands and jazz bands. All classes are adjudication and rating or adjudication only. If "adjudication only" is requested, please advise Festival secretary the day of performance.

**Open Class will be adjudication only.

10. Procedure for Secondary Bands

***** Time allotment will be 50 minutes per band {if possible} which includes set up time and adjudication. *****

- One piece selected from the 2008/2009 Canadian Musicfest list and a second contrasting selection. **Original copies of music selected must be provided for the adjudicator.**
- Conductor to notify secretary whether adjudication only is requested.
- Bands may elect to use a third piece as a warm up but are still confined to 50 (fifty) minutes and the third piece will not be adjudicated.
- Adjudication and clinic will be given to each group, time permitting. Ratings are to be given out at the end of each category.

11. Adjudicator will confirm that selection is from correct level. Written comments will be provided to each band. Comments and clinic will be presented in a positive and constructive manner. Secretary will keep time allotted accordingly and notify adjudicator as to when time is up.

12. Schools will be responsible for all necessary equipment. Chairs and risers will be provided.

13. Any complaints during the Music Festival should be submitted in writing to the Festival secretary at that time.

14. Entry fees are non-refundable and must accompany application forms.
